

ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

This original petition for a writ of mandamus challenges a district court order denying petitioners' motion to disqualify opposing counsel.


A writ of mandamus is available to compel the performance of an act that the law requires as a duty resulting from an office, trust or station¹ or to control an arbitrary or capricious exercise of discretion.² A



writ of mandamus will not issue, however, if petitioner has a plain, speedy and adequate remedy in the ordinary course of law.³ Further, mandamus is an extraordinary remedy, and it is within the discretion of this court to determine if a petition will be considered.⁴ In particular, we noted in Brown v. District Court,⁵ that disqualification is warranted if there is a "reasonable probability" that the challenged attorney acquired confidential information. We are not persuaded that the district court manifestly abused its discretion in concluding that disqualification was not warranted in this case. Accordingly, we deny the petition.⁶

It is so ORDERED.
