ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR REINSTATEMENT

This matter came to us as a petition for reciprocal discipline of attorney Brian David Green, based on a Colorado order suspending Green for failure to maintain his child and spousal support obligations. Our November 5, 2004 order imposing reciprocal discipline provided that if Green demonstrated that he had satisfied his outstanding support obligations or that he was current on a court-approved payment plan, he would be reinstated, subject to a three-year probation period with the following conditions: (1) he must certify to bar counsel each month that he is current on his support obligations, and (2) he must not violate any professional conduct rules.

Since that order was entered, Green and the state bar filed a joint "Notice of Respondent's Affidavit of Compliance," and Green has filed an affidavit of compliance and a motion for reinstatement. Green has provided this court with documentation establishing that he is current on his child support obligations, and that he is complying with a court-approved payment plan on his spousal support arrears. The state bar has stipulated that Green should be reinstated. Green has thus satisfied the terms of our November 5, 2004 order.

Accordingly, we grant Green's motion and hereby reinstate him to the practice of law. Green's reinstatement shall be subject to a three-year probation period with the conditions set forth above.

It is so ORDERED.¹
