



## ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL



This is a proper person appeal from an order of the district court denying a pretrial petition for a writ of habeas corpus. Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark County; John S. McGroarty, Judge.

Our review of this appeal reveals a jurisdictional defect. The right to appeal is statutory; where no statute or court rule provides for an appeal, no right to appeal exists.<sup>1</sup> No statute or court rule provides for an

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independent appeal from a decision of the district court denying a pretrial petition for a writ of habeas corpus.<sup>2</sup> Accordingly, we
