

## ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL




This is a proper person appeal from an order of the district court denying a motion to dismiss an indictment and an order denying a pretrial petition for a writ of habeas corpus. Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark County; Donald M. Mosley, Judge.

Our review of this appeal reveals a jurisdictional defect. The right to appeal is statutory; where no statute or court rule provides for an appeal, no right to appeal exists. No statute or court rule provides for an appeal from an order of the district court denying a motion to dismiss

indictment or a pretrial petition for a writ of habeas corpus.<sup>2</sup> Accordingly, we

ORDER this appeal DISMISSED.3
