ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

This original petition for a writ of mandamus challenges a district court order affirming the discovery commissioner's recommendation that petitioners' motion for leave to reopen discovery to allow inspection of evidence be denied.

Writ relief is an extraordinary remedy that will only issue at the discretion of this court.¹ A writ of mandamus is available to compel the performance of an act that the law requires as a duty resulting from

SUPREME COURT OF NEVADA an office, trust or station, or to control a manifest abuse of discretion.² This court will generally not entertain an extraordinary writ challenging a discovery order.³ There are, however, two exceptions to this rule.⁴ This court may consider entertaining a petition for a writ that challenges an order of the district court that either (1) is a blanket discovery order without regard to relevance, or (2) compels the disclosure of privileged information.⁵ It appears that neither of these exceptions applies in this case. Accordingly, this court's intervention by way of extraordinary relief is not warranted, and we deny the petition.⁶

It is so ORDERED.
