

ORDER DENYING PETITIONS

These are proper person petitions for extraordinary relief.¹ Petitioner seeks an order directing the White Pine County Clerk to transmit a notice of appeal to this court in district court case number WM0504005, an order directing the Clark County Clerk to file a motion to correct record in district court case number C174537, an order directing the Clark County Clerk to file a motion for leave to amend, or alternatively, adjudicate claims in district court case number A471786,

and an order directing the district court judge to recuse himself in district court case number C174537. Petitioner further challenges the denial of a motion and raises a number of challenges the validity of his judgment of conviction and sentence.

We conclude that extraordinary relief is not warranted.
