ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL



This is an appeal from an order of the district court dismissing appellant Alisandro Barajas's post-conviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus. Second Judicial District Court, Washoe County; Robert H. Perry, Judge.


On October 11, 2006, the district court entered an order resolving three of the four claims raised by Barajas in his original petition for a writ of habeas corpus. The district court determined that Barajas might be entitled to relief on the remaining claim and ordered further proceedings regarding that claim. Because the district court's order does not finally dispose of the petition, we decline to consider Barajas's appeal.¹ Accordingly, we
