ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRIT OF PROHIBITION

This original petition for a writ of prohibition challenges a district court order refusing to dismiss a complaint for declaratory relief. Petitioner asserts that the district court has improperly exercised its jurisdiction in maintaining the declaratory relief action, because the action challenges an underlying administrative decision denying a petition to amend a workers' compensation regulation. Petitioner asserts that the appropriate means by which to challenge the administrative decision is a petition for judicial review.

SUPREME COURT OF NEVADA



A writ of prohibition is available to control district court acts taken without or in excess of the court's jurisdiction.¹ This court will not exercise its discretion to consider petitions for extraordinary writ relief that challenge district court orders denying motions to dismiss, however, unless no factual issues are in dispute and dismissal is clearly required by a statute or rule, or an important issue of law requires clarification.² We have considered this petition, and we are not satisfied that this court's intervention by way of extraordinary relief is warranted at this time. Accordingly, we deny the petition.³

It is so ORDERED.4
