ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

This is a proper person appeal from an order of the district court dismissing appellant's post-conviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus. First Judicial District Court, Carson City; Michael R. Griffin, Judge.

On March 28, 2006, appellant filed a proper person post-conviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus in the district court. On July 20, 2006, the State filed a request for submission. The district court dismissed the petition on August 2, 2006. This appeal followed.

In his petition, appellant claimed that his constitutional rights were being violated because he was receiving inadequate medical treatment. Specifically, appellant claimed that he needed emergency oral surgery; the staff will not give him pain medication; the staff is rude, insensitive, unprofessional and harasses him; and he is being forced to take a treatment he completed in Folsom Prison. All of these claims challenge the conditions of appellant's confinement and are not cognizable

in a post-conviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus.¹ Accordingly, we conclude the district court did not err in dismissing appellant's petition.

Having reviewed the record on appeal and for the reasons set forth above, we conclude that appellant is not entitled to relief and that briefing and oral argument are unwarranted.² Accordingly, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.
