ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

This original proper person petition for a writ of mandamus requests this court to "grant an order to proceed in the matter of Grutgen v. Crawford."

In his petition, petitioner alleges that he had "mailed a personal injury law suit to the Clark county clerk" and that that the clerk responded with two letters explaining that petitioner's filings lacked an appropriate order for the judge's signature and that the county had no case number for petitioner's law suit. Petitioner did not attach any documents in support of his petition.

A writ of mandamus is available to compel the performance of an act that the law requires, or to control an arbitrary or capricious exercise of discretion.¹ Mandamus is an extraordinary remedy, a petition

SUPREME COURT OF NEVADA for which is addressed to this court's sole discretion.² We note that a petitioner has the burden of demonstrating that this court's intervention is warranted,³ including attaching documents necessary for this court's review.⁴ Having reviewed the petition, we determine that petitioner has not met his burden of demonstrating that extraordinary relief is warranted. Accordingly, we deny the petition,⁵

It is so ORDERED.⁶
