ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

This original petition for a writ of mandamus challenges a district court order denying a motion for a good faith settlement determination.

A writ of mandamus is available to compel the performance of an act that the law requires, or to control a manifest abuse or arbitrary or capricious exercise of discretion.¹ Mandamus is an extraordinary remedy, however, and the decision to entertain such a petition is addressed to this

SUPREME COURT OF NEVADA court's sole discretion.² Mandamus relief generally is not available when the petitioner has a plain, speedy, and adequate remedy in the ordinary course of law.³ Petitioners have the burden of demonstrating that our extraordinary intervention is warranted.⁴

Having reviewed the petition and supporting documentation, we conclude that petitioners have not met their burden to show that this court's extraordinary intervention is warranted, and, since petitioners have an adequate legal remedy by way of an appeal from any adverse final judgment, we decline to exercise our discretion to intervene. Accordingly, we

ORDER the petition DENIED.⁵
