

ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

This original proper person petition for a writ of mandamus challenges the district court's alleged refusal to grant petitioner's motion for a default judgment.

A writ of mandamus is an extraordinary remedy, and it is within our discretion to determine if a petition will be considered.¹ Writ relief in the form of mandamus is generally not available unless the district court manifestly abused its discretion.² It is petitioner's burden, moreover, to demonstrate that our extraordinary intervention is warranted.³ Under NRAP 21(a), in order to satisfy his burden of




demonstrating that extraordinary relief is warranted, petitioner must ensure that his petition includes “copies of any order or opinion or parts of the record which may be essential to an understanding of the matters set forth in the petition.”

Here, petitioner seeks to challenge the district court’s alleged refusal to grant his motion for a default judgment. Petitioner, however, has not provided this court with copies of the challenged order, his motion for default judgment, or any other supporting documentation. Accordingly, we conclude that petitioner has failed to meet his NRAP 21(a) burden of demonstrating that extraordinary relief is warranted, and we

ORDER the petition DENIED.⁴
