## ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS OR PROHIBITION

This original petition for a writ of mandamus, or in the alternative, writ of prohibition, challenges a district court order denying petitioner's motion for summary judgment in a constructional defects action.

A writ of mandamus is available to compel the performance of an act that the law requires as a duty resulting from an office, trust, or station, or to control a manifest abuse of discretion. NRS 34.160; Round Hill Gen. Imp. Dist. v. Newman, 97 Nev. 601, 637 P.2d 534 (1981). A writ of prohibition is available to arrest the proceedings of a district court exercising its judicial functions, when such proceedings are in excess of the district court's jurisdiction. NRS 34.320. Neither writ will issue when the petitioner has a plain, speedy, and adequate remedy in the course of

law, such as an appeal. NRS 34.170; NRS 34.330; <u>Pan v. Dist. Ct.</u>, 120 Nev. 222, 224, 88 P.3d 840, 844 (2004). Both mandamus and prohibition are extraordinary remedies, and it is within the discretion of this court to determine if a petition will be considered. <u>Smith v. District Court</u>, 107 Nev. 674, 818 P.2d 849 (1991). A petitioner seeking extraordinary relief has the burden of demonstrating that this court's intervention is warranted. <u>Pan</u>, 120 Nev. at 228-29, 88 P.3d at 844.

Having considered the petition and appendix, we are not satisfied that our intervention by way of extraordinary relief is warranted. Accordingly, we deny the petition. NRAP 21(b)(1); <u>Smith</u>, 107 Nev. 674, 818 P.3d 849.

It is so ORDERED.
