ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

This is an appeal from a judgment of conviction, pursuant to a jury verdict, of driving under the influence. Second Judicial District Court, Washoe County; David A. Hardy, Judge.

Appellant Maunnet James Lemay contends that the district court abused its discretion by prohibiting him from asserting a "last-gulp" defense. See NRS 484C.110(4). The district court determined that Lemay was not entitled to raise this affirmative defense because he had not provided the required notice to the State. See id. Furthermore, the State did not "open the door" to this affirmative defense by eliciting testimony that Lemay admitted to drinking after his vehicle became high-centered on a rock because an officer testified that he discovered Lemay in actual physical control of the vehicle after he admitted to consuming the alcohol. The "last-gulp" defense is only available as an affirmative defense when the defendant presents evidence that he "consumed a sufficient quantity of alcohol <u>after driving</u> or being in actual physical control of the vehicle." <u>Id.</u> Therefore, we (emphasis added). No such evidence was presented. conclude that the district court did not abuse its discretion by prohibiting Lemay from asserting the defense, see Nelson v. State, 123 Nev. 534, 548, 170 P.3d 517, 527 (2007); Brown v. State, 107 Nev. 164, 167, 807 P.2d

1379, 1381 (1991) ("the accused . . . must comply with established rules of procedure and evidence designed to assure both fairness and reliability in the ascertainment of guilt and innocence" (internal quotations omitted)), and we
