ORDER DENYING PETITION

This is an original proper person petition for assignment of a new judge, or in the alternative, that this court hear petitioner's case. We construe the petition as one seeking a writ of mandamus compelling disqualification of the district judge.¹ The petition contains no facts demonstrating that the district judge should be disqualified, only conclusory allegations that the district judge is biased. In addition, it appears that petitioner has not followed the procedure for seeking disqualification of a judge set forth in NRS 1.235, and that any such petition at this time would be untimely. Finally, we note that petitioner failed to serve the petition upon the respondent judge, in violation of NRAP 21(a).

¹We note that petitioner's alternative request seeks relief that is not available in this court. See *Round Hill Gen. Imp. Dist. v. Newman*, 97 Nev. 601, 637 P.2d 534 (1981) (noting that an appellate court is not an appropriate forum in which to resolve disputed questions of fact).

We are not satisfied that this court's intervention by way of extraordinary relief is warranted at this time. Accordingly, we deny the petition. See NRAP 21(b); State ex rel. Dep't Transp. v. Thompson, 99 Nev. 358, 662 P.2d 1338 (1983).

It is so ORDERED.²
