ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

Jeffrey Hosmer appeals from an order of the district court dismissing a postconviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus.¹ Seventh Judicial District Court, White Pine County; Gary Fairman, Judge.

Hosmer argues the district court erred in dismissing his July 11, 2016, petition. Hosmer asserted he was improperly assigned to Ely State Prison, he has been attacked because of his religion, and correctional staff members have harmed him and his family members. These claims challenge Hosmer's conditions of confinement and we conclude the district court correctly concluded these claims are not cognizable in a postconviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus. *See Bowen v. Warden*, 100 Nev. 489, 490, 686 P.2d 250, 250 (1984). Accordingly, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.
