## ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

James Howard Hayes, Jr., appeals from a district court order denying a postconviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus filed on August 16, 2017. Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark County; Linda Marie Bell, Chief Judge.

Hayes claimed the Nevada Department of Corrections was not applying the statutory credits he earned to his minimum sentence as required by NRS 209.4465(7)(b). The district court denied Hayes' petition after finding he was not entitled to have good time credits applied his parole eligibility date because he committed a category B felony after NRS 209.4465 was amended in 2007 and NRS 209.4465(8)(d) excludes category B felons from receiving credit toward their minimum sentence. We conclude
