ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

Gerry Foster appeals from an order of the district court denying a "motion for modification of sentence pursuant to NRS 453.3405(2)." Second Judicial District Court, Washoe County; Elliott A. Sattler, Judge.

An order revoking Foster's probation and imposing the underlying term of imprisonment was filed in February 2017. In the instant motion, filed on October 13, 2017, Foster moved the district court to reduce or modify his sentence, claiming it had misapprehended the level of assistance Foster provided to law enforcement. "Generally, a district court lacks jurisdiction to suspend or modify a sentence after the defendant has begun to serve it." Passanisi v. State, 108 Nev. 318, 322, 831 P.2d 1371, 1373 (1992), overruled on other grounds by Harris v. State, 130 Nev. 435, 446-47, 329 P.3d 619, 627 (2014). Nothing in the language of NRS 453,3405(2) signals a legislative intent to override the general rule. We

therefore conclude the district court did not err by denying Foster's motion.² Accordingly, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.3
