ORDER DENYING PETITION

This original petition for a writ of mandamus challenges the Nevada Board of Parole Commissioners' denial of parole for Ahud Chaziza. Chaziza asserts he was denied his right to be considered for parole because the Board improperly applied NAC 213.518(2)(k) when considering him for parole. Chaziza also asserts that the Board violated NRS 213.142(1) by rescheduling his next parole hearing so that it will exceed 3 years between hearings. Chaziza asks this court to order the Board to grant him a new parole hearing at which the identified errors are corrected.

Subsequent to filing this petition, Chaziza filed a notice to this court that included a letter addressed to him from the Board. In that letter, the Board notes that Chaziza's last parole hearing was on May 30, 2018, and his next hearing is scheduled for August 2020, which is within the 3 years mandated by statute. The letter also acknowledges Chaziza was correct that NAC 213.518(2)(k) was improperly applied to him and states that this aggravating factor has been removed from his record. The letter concludes, "It is the decision of the Board to maintain the denial of parole despite the removal of the noted aggravating factor and denial reason." Also

attached to the notice is a copy of an Amended Order Denying Parole, which supports all of the Board's statements in the letter.

Given the record before this court, we conclude Chaziza has not demonstrated this court's intervention by way of extraordinary writ is warranted. See NRS 34.160; Anselmo v. Bisbee, 133 Nev. 317, 323, 396 P.3d 848, 853 (2017); Pan v. Eighth Judicial Dist. Court, 120 Nev. 222, 228, 88 P.3d 840, 844 (2004). Accordingly, we

ORDER the petition DENIED.
