ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE


James Lamont Moore appeals from an order of the district court denying a postconviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus.¹ Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark County; Linda Marie Bell, Chief Judge.


In his November 29, 2017, petition, Moore claimed the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) improperly declined to apply his statutory credits toward his parole eligibility dates and the refusal to apply those credits toward his parole eligibility violated his right against ex post facto punishments. The district court reviewed Moore's convictions and credit history report, and found he committed his offenses in 1994 and was therefore entitled to application of statutory credits toward his parole eligibility dates pursuant to NRS 209.446(6)(b). The district court further found NDOC had already and properly applied Moore's statutory credits toward his remaining minimum terms as required by NRS 209.446(6)(b), and concluded Moore was not entitled to any further relief. The record

supports the district court's conclusions. Therefore, the district court did not err by denying the petition. Accordingly, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.
