



ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

Craig Jackson appeals from an order of the district court denying a postconviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus filed on June 7, 2017.

Our review of the record reveals a jurisdictional defect. The March 21, 2018, order denying Jackson's petition did not resolve all of the claims raised in the petition. Specifically, it did not address Jackson's claim that the Nevada Department of Corrections is failing to apply credits he earned pursuant to NRS 209.4465 to his maximum sentences. The order thus was not a final order. *See Sandstrom v. Second Judicial Dist. Court*, 121 Nev. 657, 659, 119 P.3d 1250, 1252 (2005) ("[A] final order [is] one that disposes of all issues and leaves nothing for future consideration."). Accordingly, we lack jurisdiction to consider this appeal, and we

ORDER this appeal DISMISSED.
