## ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR


## WRIT OF CERTIORARI, MANDAMUS, OR PROHIBITION

This is an original petition for a writ of certiorari, mandamus, or prohibition challenging the district court's order imposing sanctions against petitioners for violating SCR 182. We have considered the petition, and we are not satisfied that this court's intervention by way of extraordinary relief is warranted.<sup>1</sup>

Accordingly, we deny the petition.<sup>2</sup> The motion to extend the district court's stay is denied as moot.
