ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

Corey Johnson appeals from an order denying a postconviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus filed on November 17, 2020. Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark County; Erika D. Ballou, Judge.

Johnson filed a petition challenging the revocation of his parole. Johnson's petition was successive because he had previously filed a postconviction petition for a writ of habeas corpus that was decided on the merits, and the claims in this petition were the same as the claims raised in his prior petition. See NRS 34.810(2). Thus, Johnson's petition was procedurally barred absent a demonstration of good cause and actual prejudice. See NRS 34.810(3). Johnson did not allege any good cause or prejudice to overcome the procedural bar. Therefore, we conclude the district court did not err by denying the petition as procedurally barred. Accordingly, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.
