ORDER DISMISSING PETITION FOR

WRIT OF MANDAMUS

This is an original petition for a writ of mandamus seeking to compel respondents to redistrict all state voting districts and U.S. Congressional districts by June 30, 2001.

On June 26, 2001, petitioners filed notice of withdrawal of this original writ petition, and consented to its voluntary dismissal. According to petitioners, the respondents met on June 14, 2001, during the special legislative session called by the Governor, and accomplished all of the tasks for which petitioners sought relief under this petition. Thus, petitioners contend that the petition for a writ of mandamus is moot, and petitioners move this court for permission to withdraw their petition or that it be dismissed, with all parties to bear their own fees and costs.

Accordingly, we hereby dismiss the petition for a writ of mandamus, and the parties shall bear their own costs. NRAP 42(b).

It is so ORDERED.
