ORDER DENYING PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

This is an original proper person petition for a writ of mandamus seeking an order from this court directing respondents to provide petitioners with treatment for Hepatitis-C and all prisoners educational information regarding the disease.

A writ of mandamus is available to compel the performance of an act that the law requires as a duty resulting from an office, trust, or station,¹ or to control an arbitrary or capricious exercise of discretion.² The issuance of a writ "is purely discretionary" with this court.³

We have considered the petition and answer, and we are not
