ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL AS ABANDONED

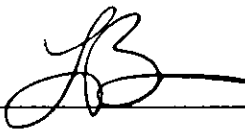
On June 25, 2025, this court granted appellant's counsel's motion to withdraw and directed appellant to retain new counsel and cause new counsel to file a notice of appearance within 30 days. On July 8, 2025, the settlement judge reported that the parties had agreed to a settlement of the matter prior to this court granting appellant's counsel's withdrawal and had executed a written settlement agreement at an April 28, 2025, mediation. The settlement judge explained that she had delayed filing the final report to allow the parties the additional time needed to effectuate certain settlement terms. On July 9, 2025, this court entered an order directing appellant to file a stipulation or motion to dismiss this appeal or otherwise inform this court of the status of this appeal within 30 days.

On August 5, 2025, appellant filed a motion for extension of time to find an attorney. The motion was stricken by this court because it was deficient and appellant was given 7 days to file a corrected motion. Because appellant had not yet filed a corrected motion, on September 18, 2025, this court entered an order directing appellant to file a corrected motion within 14 days and warned that failure to comply would result in

the dismissal of this appeal as abandoned. To date, appellant has failed to comply with this court's September 18, 2025, order. Accordingly, we dismiss this appeal as abandoned.

It is so ORDERED.
