

ORDER DENYING PETITION

This is a pro se original petition for a writ of mandamus seeking the enforcement of default judgments in four district court cases.¹ The petition raises essentially the same arguments as the petitions in *Johnson*

¹Petitioner seeks emergency relief, however, petitioner does not demonstrate that the failure to grant her petition within 14 days will result in irreparable harm, *see* NRAP 21(a)(6); NRAP 27(e), and thus, we decline to treat this matter as an emergency.

v. Eighth Judicial District Court, Docket No. 91672, which was denied on December 8, 2025, and *Johnson v. Eighth Judicial District Court*, Docket No. 91744, which was denied on December 15, 2025.


Having reviewed the instant petition and accompanying appendix, we conclude that petitioner has not demonstrated that our extraordinary intervention is warranted, for the same reasons noted in the order denying the petitions in Docket No. 91672 and Docket No. 91744. See *Pan v. Eighth Jud. Dist. Ct.*, 120 Nev. 222, 228, 88 P.3d 840, 844 (2004) (observing that the party seeking writ relief bears the burden of showing such relief is warranted); *Smith v. Eighth Jud. Dist. Ct.*, 107 Nev. 674, 677, 818 P.2d 849, 851 (1991) (recognizing that writ relief is an extraordinary remedy and that this court has sole discretion in determining whether to entertain a writ petition). Accordingly, we

ORDER the petition DENIED.




