ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

This is a proper person appeal from a district court order denying appellant's petition for a writ of mandamus compelling the chair of the State Bar Fee Dispute Committee to enter a ruling on appellant's appeal to the chair from a fee dispute arbitration award. The record reflects that the district court denied appellant's petition as moot, because during the pendency of the district court proceedings the chair entered an order denying the appeal. We agree that the petition was moot, and consequently, the district court's order was proper.¹

We further note that the district court specifically stated that its order was without prejudice to any methods available to appellant to challenge the chair's ruling. Appellant may seek appropriate review of the fee dispute chair's ruling, if he so desires.²

Accordingly, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.³
