

ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL


This is a pro se appeal from a district court order denying defendant's fundamental miscarriage of justice claim and motion for appointment of counsel. Eighth Judicial District Court, Clark County; Tara D. Clark Newberry, Judge.

This court's review of this appeal reveals jurisdictional defects. Specifically, no court rule or statute allows for an appeal from the aforementioned order. *See Castillo v. State*, 106 Nev. 349, 352, 792 P.2d 1133, 1135 (1990) (explaining that this court has jurisdiction only when statute or court rule provides for appeal). To the extent the claim could be considered a petition to establish factual innocence despite the district court's conclusion otherwise, the order is not appealable per NRS 34.970(9) and *Sanchez v. State*, 140 Nev., Adv. Op. 78, 561 P.3d 35, 39 (2024) ("[N]o court rule or statute authorizes an appeal from an order dismissing an innocence petition without prejudice under NRS 34.960."). Accordingly, this court lacks jurisdiction and

ORDERS this appeal DISMISSED.
