ORDER OF DISBARMENT BY CONSENT

The Chair of the Southern Nevada Disciplinary Board has submitted, under SCR 112, a petition for attorney Shawn F. Hackman's disbarment by consent. The petition is supported by Hackman's affidavit, stating that he freely and voluntarily consents to disbarment, after consulting with counsel. Hackman acknowledges in the affidavit that the formal disciplinary complaint filed against him by the state bar sets forth violations of SCR 151 (competence), SCR 153 (diligence), SCR 154 (communication), SCR 165 (safekeeping property) and SCR 203 (misconduct). Hackman further concedes that the material facts in the complaint are true, although he disputes the accuracy of the monetary amounts alleged to have been misappropriated.


SCR 112 provides that an attorney who is the subject of a proceeding involving allegations of misconduct may consent to disbarment by delivering an affidavit to the appropriate disciplinary board, which must file it with this court. Hackman's affidavit meets the requirements


of SCR 112(1), and we conclude that the petition should be granted. Accordingly, Hackman is disbarred. The provisions of SCR 115 governing notice and publication of orders of disbarment shall apply to this order.


It is so ORDERED.
