ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

This is a proper person appeal from a district court order dismissing appellant's complaint for failure to state a claim upon which relief can be granted, pursuant to NRCP 12(b)(5).

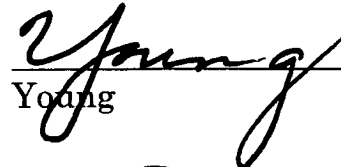
Having reviewed the record in this matter, we conclude that the district court properly dismissed the complaint.¹ In particular, appellant challenges the constitutionality of Nevada's burglary statute under which he was convicted. The district court properly concluded that this claim was limited to a post-conviction petition for writ of habeas corpus.² As for appellant's remaining claims, we conclude that appellant

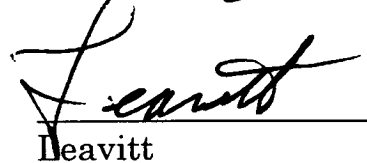

failed to set forth in his pleadings allegations sufficient to establish a right to relief.³ Accordingly, we

ORDER the judgment of the district court AFFIRMED.
