This is a proper person appeal from an order of the district court denying a motion for jailtime credits. The sole issue presented in this appeal is whether appellant received sufficient jailtime credits. The district court determined that this issue had been previously raised in a motion to amend the judgment of conviction. In denying appellant's motion for jailtime credits, the district court reaffirmed its prior September 16, 2002 order denying relief.


On February 12, 2004, in an appeal from the September 16, 2002 order denying appellant's motion to amend the judgment of conviction, this court reversed the order of the district court and remanded the matter to the district court to award additional jailtime credits.¹ Because this court has already determined that appellant is entitled to the


