

## ORDER OF AFFIRMANCE

This is a proper person appeal from a district court order that dismissed appellant's dental malpractice claim.

NRS 41A.071, enacted in the Nevada Legislature's 2002 special session, requires a party filing an action for dental malpractice in the district court to include an affidavit supporting the allegations contained in the complaint. The affidavit must be submitted by a medical expert who practices or has practiced in an area that is substantially similar to the type of practice engaged in at the time of the alleged malpractice. The district court "shall dismiss the action, without prejudice," if an action is filed without the required affidavit.<sup>1</sup>

Appellant Linda Harikian filed a dental malpractice action against respondent without a supporting affidavit. The district court
