Memorandum of Points and Authorities

Summary

Petitioner has been recognized as a news reporter by the Supreme Court, Court of Appeals, and Commission on Judicial Discipline; and, Districts 1, 2, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10; and, the Reno, Las Vegas, North Las Vegas, Beatty, Pahrump, Dayton, Sparks, and Virginia City Justice Courts; and, the Las Vegas, Henderson, and Reno Municipal Courts. SCR 229(1)(c). The Supreme Court, through its promulgation of the SCR 230(2) presumption, publication of *Solid v. Eighth Jud. Dist. Ct*, 133 Nev. 118, 393 P.3d 666 (2017), and consideration of the emergency writ petition filed in Supreme Court docket no. 85195², has illustrated the importance of the use of electronic coverage as an educational and informational tool. Indeed, the Supreme Court has tied the electronic coverage presumption to any proceeding open to the public in recognition of the obvious fact that it would expand the public's opportunity to actually observe our judicial proceedings. See also Supreme Court docket no. 84947³. The importance of Petitioner's work and cooperation with the American Civil Liberties Union has also been recognized by the Las Vegas Review Journal in an editorial criticizing the Family Division of this District's efforts to interfere with public access to domestic relations matters. Exhibit 1.

Petitioner is entitled to costs under two theories. Preferably, this Court will dismiss the writ petition citing mootness, confer prevailing party status upon Petitioner under the catalyst theory, and impose costs. Alternatively, this Court can consider the writ petition under the mootness exception, issue the writ, confer prevailing party status upon Petitioner, and impose costs.

The extraordinary writ is the only available remedy. SCR 243.

Factual Background

On July 12, 2022, Petitioner submitted a media request. Exhibit 2. Respondent acknowledged receipt. Exhibit 3.

On July 18, 2022, Respondent denied the media request. Exhibit 4. Exhibit 5. Petitioner acknowledged receipt. Exhibit 6.

On July 19, 2022, Petitioner instituted the instant proceedings and provided courtesy copy to Respondent. Exhibit 7. Deputy City Attorney Jeffrey Galliher contacted Petitioner *via* phone to advise that the denial occurred because the proceeding was continued. Respondent explained that the docket did not reflect this and that the hearing was still scheduled but Mr. Galliher advised that eventually an updated hearing date would become available. Mr. Galliher also explained that, in the future, the Las Vegas Municipal Court would notify the media of continuances when an SCR 230(1) request ('media request') is pending, rather than summarily deny without explanation.

On July 27, 2022, Petitioner submitted a media request. Exhibit 8.

On August 11, 2022, Respondent continued the hearing. Exhibit 9. Petitioner withdrew the media request. Exhibit 10. Petitioner submitted a new media request. Exhibit 11.

On August 24, 2022, Respondent apparently⁴ approved the media request. Exhibit 12. Exhibit 13. Respondent sought clarification on approval. Exhibit 14.

On August 29, 2022, Respondent vacated the hearing. Exhibit 15. Petitioner acknowledged. Exhibit 16.

This motion follows.

Argument

NRS 18.020(4) mandates an award of costs to the prevailing party in a special proceeding. *Foley v. Kennedy*, 110 Nev. 1295, ____, 885 P. 2d 583, 588, (1994). citing *Day v. West Coast Holdings, Inc.*, 101 Nev. 260, 264, 699 P.2d 1067, 1070 (1985).

The Catalyst Theory

"Under the catalyst theory, attorney fees may be awarded even when litigation does not result in a judicial resolution if the defendant changes its behavior substantially because of, and in the manner sought by, the litigation." LVMPD v. Center For Investigative Reporting, 136 Nev. 122, 460 P. 3d 952, 954, (2020), citing Graham v. DaimlerChrysler Corp., 34 Cal.4th 553, 21 Cal.Rptr.3d 331, 101 P.3d 140, 144 (2004). Applying the catalyst theory, it was determined "that respondent was entitled to reasonable attorney fees and costs under NRS 239.011(2)." Id. The catalyst-theory analysis was elaborated upon in Las Vegas Review Journal v. Henderson, 137 Nev. ____, 500 P. 3d 1271, 1276, (2021). The contemplated analysis stems from our Court's reliance on Graham v. DaimlerChrysler Corp.'s declination to abolish the catalyst theory, and instead clarify. Specifically, "a plaintiff must not only be a catalyst to defendant's changed behavior, but the lawsuit must have some merit [] and the plaintiff must have engaged in a reasonable attempt to settle its dispute with the defendant prior to litigation." This principle is at the heart of the five prong analysis set forth in Las Vegas Review Journal v. Henderson.

Respondent's summary denial of the media request without the particularized findings mandated by SCR 230(2) aggrieved Petitioner, meriting the filing of the writ petition. The purpose of the particularized findings is to explain to the news reporter or objector the basis for the ruling, so that a higher court can consider the propriety of the ruling on writ review. SCR 243. *Solid v. Eighth Jud. Dist. Ct., Id.* Petitioner's writ petition triggered a necessary correction,

as Respondent subsequently would notify Petitioner of continuances. Petitioner's ability to "settle its dispute" is limited, as news reporters can only communicate to the courts in the context of SCR 230(1) requests in a limited manner so as to avoid the appearance of impropriety and *ex parte* communications. Under these circumstances, an award of costs under the catalyst theory is appropriate.

The Mootness Exception

The mootness exception was invoked in the context of a writ petition challenging a media request approval pursuant to SCR 243 in *Solid v. Eighth Jud. Dist. Ct.*, 393 P.3d at 670. This Court could also invoke the mootness exception here and issue the writ under NRS 34.190, which may involve directing a response. NRS 34.200. Petitioner does not urge this approach, as it does not appear the issue is capable of repetition due to Respondent now complying with SCR 230, and also because it would involve more litigation.

Conclusion

Petitioner requests this Court dismiss the petition as moot, and award \$270 in costs⁵ under the catalyst theory; or, in the alternative, for this Court to issue an alternative writ of mandamus; or, in the alternative, for this Court to direct a response to the writ petition.

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EDITORIAL: New Family Court rule is an affront to justice

Justice is supposed to blind, but it ceases to be justice if nobody can see it. The folks at Clark County District Court need a reminder of their obligations under the Bill of Rights and the importance of transparency.

Last week, the Nevada chapter of the ACLU asked the Nevada Supreme Court to overturn a new rule that limits public access to Family Court proceedings in Clark County. "The new rule violates the First Amendment," Sophia Romero, an ACLU attorney, said in a release, "and undercuts confidence in an already frail Family Court system."







Under the reformed guidelines — approved by the high court in April at the request of a petition filed by District Court Chief Judge Linda Bell and District Judge Joseph Hardy — judges may close Family Court proceedings whenever they please. Previously, only divorce case hearings could be conducted privately without cause.

The legal underpinnings for even that exception are shaky. But a carte blanche to shut out the public from any and all Family Court matters? That's dangerous and an invitation for Star Chamber justice.

The edict is apparently a colossal overreaction aimed at hampering Alexander Falconi, who created the Our Nevada Judges website, which follows various Family Court proceedings and includes videos of hearings and other details. Mr. Falconi, who took up his hobby after experiencing the court firsthand while defending himself in a child custody case, said he redacts names and blurs faces when necessary.

But while Mr. Falconi's scrutiny may be uncomfortable for some judges, lawyers and litigants, that is no justification for this response.

Family Court — which deals with cases involving divorce, annulment, child custody, spousal support, community property division, adoption and abuse and neglect — is a hotbed of controversy and raw emotion. The vast majority of grievances about judicial outcomes stem from Family Court disputes. Increased secrecy will only exacerbate the bitterness and further fuel complaints about bias and fairness.

In addition, making it more difficult for watchdogs and taxpayers to determine whether this system operates in an efficient, acceptable fashion and whether judges are up to the task is a recipe for weakening public confidence in Family Court. Occasional efforts to shield young children involved in court matters may be appropriate, but the default setting in any judicial proceeding in a free nation must be openness rather than secrecy.

Injustice flourishes absent transparency and accountability. The new rule is an affront to both. The Supreme Court must reverse course to ensure that — barring extraordinary circumstances — the public has access to these proceedings.


