MEDIA ORDER Pursuant to SCR 230

Having been advised that media representative(s) have contacted the court in regards to proceedings in this matter, and having considered the impact of coverage upon the rights of the parties to a fair hearing; the impact of coverage upon the safety and well-being of the parties and witnesses, their respective rights of privacy and the and the likelihood that coverage would distract participants or detract from the dignity of the proceedings; the adequacy of the physical facilities of the court for coverage and such other factors that may affect the fair administration of justice;

CAUSE APPEARING and pending further order of the court, media cameras may be used at proceedings in this matter, but only as follows:

- 1. There will be <u>no</u> artificial lighting devices allowed in Court.

 If any media camera has an illumination device as an integral component of the camera, the light(s) on the camera shall be disconnected and proof shown to the bailiff before such camera will be permitted into the Courtroom.
- 2. Only one (1) still media camera and only one (1) video/motion picture media camera may be used during any court session. If there are cameras that would exceed this number, media representatives shall select one (1) still photographer and one (1) video/motion picture photographer to act as "pool" photographers.
- 3. All Pool photographers are ordered to immediately share their work product.
- 4. No media camera may be operated in such a fashion as to create a disturbance to the Court, its staff, counsel or courtroom observers.
- 5. The location of all media photographer(s) is subject to the direction and control of the bailiff. Absent good cause, media cameras must be located in the back row of the Courtroom and photographers must remain seated during filming.
- 6. All media cameras are subject to inspection at all times by the bailiff.

- 7. All photographers must sign a copy of this Order prior to bringing any media camera into the Courtroom. <u>Non-media</u> cameras are not permitted in Court at any time.
- 8. Film, videotape, photography and audio/digital reproductions of this proceeding may not be used for unrelated advertising purposes.
- 9. No media may record the sound, voice or person of any juror.
 During jury selection, all media recording devices and cameras shall be put away.
- 10. The Clerk is directed to provide a copy of this order to all attorneys, all parties and to the media pool coordinator or his designee.
- 11. It shall be the responsibility of attorneys to notify their witnesses of this order.
